

4. CYCLE 1. CANOE Watenc 2. CYCLE 3. TREK

The Challenge

- 3 day event with the triathlon taking place on the second day
- Based in Keswick, this challenge will see participants canoeing, cycling and trekking through the beautiful scenery of the Lake District
- The challenge is not a race and is designed to be a team activity for participants of all abilities.
- The challenge begins at Derwentwater where
 participants will canoe around St Herbert's island before
 jumping on their bikes and begin the climb up to
 Gatesgarth Farm. From here the group will trek up to
 Haystacks with qualified mountain leaders where they'll
 take in the amazing views of the Lake District. The final
 stage will see participants getting back on their bikes and
 cycling down the steep Honnister pass to the finish line!

Itinerary

Day 1

Participants to make their own way to Keswick and onto their chosen accommodation. Once the team has arrived everyone will meet for a group dinner and event briefing.

Day 2

After breakfast participants will have the chance to prepare for the cycling challenge by getting their bike fitted and preparing their cycling/trekking clothes.

Stage 1: Participants will head down to the canoe centre. They will be in pairs in open Canadian canoes so it is a team effort to get round St Herbert's island and back to the canoe centre. *Approx 1.5 hours*

Stage 2: Participants will get changed into cycling gear and head back up to the hotel. They will then cycle uphill from Lodore Falls to Gatesgarth Farm. There will be a chance to stop and admire the picturesque scenery while testing their stamina!

Approx 8 miles

Stage 3: participants will regroup and enjoy a packed lunch before changing into trekking gear. From here participants begin the 600 m ascent up the rough trail to Haystacks. *Approx 2.5 hours and 6 miles*

Stage 4: This is the final push on bike as participants head up Newlands Pass back and around Derwentwater back to the start point. This is a steep twisty road so will require some concentration. *Approx 13 miles*.

Day 3

After breakfast we all say our goodbyes and head home.
